Voya Global Perspectives Fund Receives Four-Star Rating from Morningstar

Voya Investment Management, the asset management business of Voya Financial, Inc. (NYSE: VOYA), announced today that Morningstar™ has given the Voya Global Perspectives Fund a four-star rating for its class I shares as of March 31, 2016, in the U.S. OE World Allocation category — other share classes may have different performance characteristics. With approximately \$37 million in assets, the fund seeks a total return by investing in a combination of underlying funds that invest directly in securities, such as stocks and bonds, of issuers in a number of different countries.

Managed by Douglas Coté, CFA, Voya Investment Management's chief market strategist, and Karyn Cavanaugh, CFA, senior market strategist, the fund provides a broad global diversification based on market fundamentals, which involves a tactical asset allocation that helps investors maintain long-term investment discipline by providing equal weighting of multiple asset classes to provide broad global diversity that may help protect return.

"The Voya Global Perspectives Fund and Portfolio have been described as 'sophisticated simplicity,'" said Coté. "Its broad global diversification, equal weighted mix of assets and regular rebalancing make it easy to understand. But its defensive risk management that anticipates market duress is what makes it stand out among its category peers."

For each fund with at least a three-year history, Morningstar™ calculates a Morningstar Rating based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance.

The top 10% of funds in each category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. (Each share class is counted as a fraction of one fund within this scale and rated separately, which may cause slight variations in the distribution percentages.) The Overall Morningstar Rating for a fund is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and 10-year (if applicable).

The Morningstar Rating is for the class I share only; other classes may have different performance characteristics. The numerical ranking shown indicates the fund's total-return percentile rank relative to all funds that have the same Morningstar category. The highest (or most favorable) percentile rank is 1 and the lowest (or least favorable) percentile rank is 100. The top-performing fund in a category will always receive a rank of 1. This fund ranked 28th, out of 476 funds in its category, for three-year annualized returns.
